

Accelerate language development for English learners

For Newcomers & Intermediate ELs

Personalized, adaptive instruction—complete with first-language support—meets newcomers and intermediate ELs where they are in their path to language acquisition.

- **Personalized learning pathways** provide just-right instruction for students with varying degrees of proficiency in English and varying degrees of literacy in their first language.
- Strategic L1 support (available in 15 languages) delivers direct vocabulary instruction and activity directions in the student's first language. As students' proficiency grows, the program gradually withdraws first-language scaffolding.
- **Explicit instruction in phonemes** not found in a student's first language targets individual instructional needs.
- Concepts such as rhyme are taught in the student's first language to **build background knowledge,** before transferring the skill to English.
- Three levels of vocabulary instruction, beginning with basic and culminating in advanced academic vocabulary, elevate language proficiency and participation in whole-class activities.

For Advanced & Long-term ELs

Through a blended learning model, students gain confidence to read complex texts independently and practice the conventions of academic discourse.

- Students learn how grammar and syntax—key components of **academic language**—affect meaning by unpacking complex texts at the sentence level.
- Multimedia scaffolds, including audio playback, videos with text captioning, photos, and graphics, provide background knowledge to support comprehension during independent reading.
- Vocabulary support for reading passages is provided at point-of-use through contextual annotations and an embedded dictionary.
- Students can **highlight and annotate texts**, which aids them in formulating ideas for written responses and classroom discussions.
